Directive No. STCW/10

ISSUE OF SHIPS' COOK CERTIFICATE

Issued under the enabling power of the Ministerial Resolution 6/2001
and including STCW 2010 Manila Amendments

1. Requirements

The PMA may issue ships' cook certificate, as given in the annex to this directive, under the relevant ILO Convention of 1946, as amended, upon the applicant shall have satisfactorily completed and provide documentary evidence of the following:

- proof of identity and nationality;
- Age and Sea Time - Applicants must be not less than 18 years of age with minimum of 3 months seagoing service.
- Medical - Applicants must be certified by the medical examiner to be free of communicable diseases. Copy of Seafarers Medical Fitness Certificate is required.
- Basic Safety Training (STCW A-VI/1);
- Training - Applicants must have successfully completed a legitimate training course or program covering practical cookery and food preparation, food and personal hygiene, galley sanitation, nutrition, food storage, stock control, environmental protection and catering health and safety.

2. Documentation:

Vessels are required to have on board documentation attesting to the satisfactory training and qualifications of the Cook or Cooks serving on board.



3. Revision history:

Revision No. 2 of the present Directive supersedes the Directives Number 11, which was published by the President of Customs and Ports on 24th October 2001.
